

Crazy 'Jar' Creature

Berol[®]

You will need:

Berol Glass Pens
Berol Colour Marker
Glass Jar – with lid
Tissue Paper
Funky Foam
Scissors
Googly Eyes
Sticky Tape
Double Sided Sticky Tape
Stickers and Glitter



What to do?

1. Collect empty jars, peel off the label, wash and dry completely.
2. Stuff the jar with light coloured tissue paper until it is full. Screw on the lid and turn the jar upside down.
3. Use tissue paper and sticky tape to cover the jar lid.
4. Loosely screw tissue paper up into a head shape and use sticky tape to attach the head of the creature to the bottom of the jar.
5. Using the Berol glass pens, draw designs all over the jar to mimic a camouflage pattern.
6. Using funky foam and a pen, draw some arms and cut these out. Using Berol colour markers to add on some spots. Attach the arms to the jar using sticky tape.
7. Using funky foam and a pen, draw some feet and cut these out. Attach the feet to the jar using sticky tape.
8. Using funky foam and a pen, draw some antennae and attach these to the head using sticky tape.
9. Attach googly eyes to the head of the creature.
10. Using foam, stickers or Berol marker pens create a beak or mouth for your creature.

Additional Information

Look at the weird and wonderful creatures around the world.

Look at two different animals to get ideas for a design. For example you could take a butterfly and frog. Use parts from each creature to design your own.

Depending on your classroom topic, these jar creatures can fit any theme. From winter to springtime animals this template for design is flexible and fun.

The children could name their creature and write a story about its life.
